CIVIC AFFAIRS AND CONSERVATION 2020-2021

PLASTICS

This year of Covid and Zoom meetings presented both challenges and opportunities for all club members. While Conservation held no in-person workshops, we were indeed fortunate to create a webinar on plastics, featuring two very prominent women:

Judith Enck, Founder and President of Beyond Plastics, whose mission is to end plastic pollution through education, advocacy, and institutional change. Former EPA Region 2 Regional Administrator, appointed by President Obama, and former Deputy Secretary for the Environment in the New York Governor's Office.

Sherri "Sam" Mason, Ph.D., former Chair, Department of Geology & Environmental Sciences, SUNY-Fredonia where she was among the first to study the prevalence and impact of plastic pollution within freshwater ecosystems. Her work formed the basis for the 2015 Microbeads-Free Water Act. Recipient of the Heinz Award in Public Policy in 2018. Currently she is Sustainability Coordinator at Penn State Behrend.

- Micro-plastics and Drinking Water
- Oceans
- Cracker Plants
- Plastics and Climate Change
- Recycling is Not an Option
- Why We MUST Eliminate Single Use Disposable Plastic
- What You Can Do

Because it was a Zoom call, we worked with Andrea Stewart, Zone III Conservation Chair, to invite all members of Zone III Clubs to participate in the call. We are proud to announce that 153 GCA members signed up for the call.

Their presentation spoke of plastics as a significant health problem - no water, fresh or ocean, tap water or bottled water, is free from microscopic plastic particles that affect our health. Furthermore, plastic production is a continuing climate change issue as oil and gas producers are using fossil fuels to create plastic pellets which are then sent worldwide to enable the expansion of any manner of plastic uses.

The four action steps we promoted in follow up emails to those who registered, included:

#1 FEDERAL LEGISLATION/ACTION

Contact our legislators to pass *The Break Free From Plastic Pollution Act*, which is the gold standard of Federal legislation to make meaningful reductions in the amount of plastic pollution in the US.

To get the nitty-gritty on how *The Break Free From Plastic Pollution Act* (HR 2238, S 984) will reduce plastic pollution and reform our broken waste and recycling system, go to https://www.beyondplastics.org/bffppa -- where you will learn exactly what the legislation provides and you'll be able to easily contact your members of Congress to ask them to support the legislation.

In addition to supporting the legislation, there are several more actions each of us can take that are explained on the Beyond Plastics website. Please visit and we suggest you do all of them! https://www.beyondplastics.org/act

#2 MEALS ON WHEELS

Nationally Meals on Wheels (MOW) serves 2.4 million meals each day, it's a VERY important organization that supports our senior citizens. Because MOW is controlled at the local level, each of us can appeal to our local MOW's, this is the epitome of a real grassroots effort!

Alexis Goldsmith of Beyond Plastics is managing this campaign to urge MOW to switch to reusable containers, away from single use plastics. We want to encourage ALL of you to reach out to Alexis to let her know you're ready to help encourage your local MOW make this switch and to inform them that Alexis will be happy to provide the support they need — it's a big but potentially HIGHLY IMPACTFUL undertaking.

- 4. Avoid coffee or tea to go the lid and cup with its plastic liner will live for more than 100 years
- 5. Don't use plastic water bottles
- 6. Buy eggs in paper not plastic containers
- 7. Store food in pyrex/glass containers
- 8. Don't use ziploc use aluminum or wax paper
- 9. Compost food waste this reduces use of plastic trash bags
- 10.Buy coffee in paper containers

We are proud to report that two members of our club have already taken action. Nancy Vincent has contacted our local supermarket to ask them to change their practices vis a vis plastic packaging and Cynthia Mas worked with our local golf and tennis club to encourage a shift away from supplying plastic water bottles to encouraging members to use their own water bottles. It is estimated that this effort will eliminate the annual use of 41,000 plastic water bottles!

Next year, we intend to work on more action steps, including support for federal and state extended producer responsibility legislation on plastics.

CIVIC ACTION

In the Civic arena, we were able to work with Joyce Corrigan and the Hort Committee to create a full-page ad in our local paper that addressed the need to protect key insects from pesticides. This allowed us to support our local paper with ad revenue as well as advance important gardening practices.

SANCTUARIES

2020-2021

AUDUBON SANCTUARIES:

While Bedford Audubon was started in 1913, it wasn't until 2001 that it gained its current home at Bylane Farm, generously donated to Bedford Audubon by the family of BGC member Mary Welsh Parker. The Parker family home, known as Bylane Farm, dates from the early 1700's, and is an historical treasure

that continues to use water- and energy- efficient practices and eco-friendly materials to maintain its historically minimal ecological footprint.

Bylane Farm hosts the offices, conference and meeting space for Bedford Audubon, and the John L. Bull Library of books, manuscripts, and paintings, as well as housing for their Naturalist-in-Residence, seasonal staff and interns, and visiting researchers and speakers.

Today, Bylane Farm is the center of Bedford Audubon operations, co-located with the Leon Levy Native Garden and the Hunt-Parker Sanctuary in both Bedford and Lewisboro totaling 338 acres and 5 miles of trails. Hunt-Parker is considered the crown jewel sanctuary in Bedford Audubon's network as it is their largest sanctuary.

Another significant sanctuary is the Ruth Walgreen Franklin & Winifred Fels Sanctuary in North Salem, with 204 acres and 3 miles of trails. Further, Bedford Audubon is responsible for the regular oversight of the Rose & Rockshelter Preserve and the Pine Croft Meadow Preserve owned by the Westchester Land Trust and the O'Donohue Preserve owned by the North Salem Open Land Foundation.

Due to severe social restrictions as a result of government mandate during the Covid shutdowns, we as a club were unable to visit Bedford Audubon this year. But we look forward to making regular visits and partaking of the interesting and varied programs Bedford Audubon at Bylane Farm offers next year.

MARSH SANCTUARY:

Sanctuary activities, community awareness and daily visits have grown enormously since the 2020-2021 pandemic. It is an

outdoor refuge and educational resource for the entire community far and wide.

Our relationship with the Rewilding School has also expanded with daily programs for children from preschool to adult during the school year and as well as 2 summer camps. This spring, trees donated by the Watershed Agricultural Council were planted around the pond. BGC and Rusticus donated funds for a no-mow riparian planting project along the Kisco River and Cook's Pond. The Community Garden is active and fully subscribed with the school using 4 plots for teaching purposes. Neighbors generously donated funds to remove dangerous and unsightly dead ash trees adding to the visitor appeal and safety of the property.

Windows and doors were replaced at historic Brookside Cottage to help with heat retention in the winter and greatly improving general appearance from the road. The roof at the caretaker's Meadowside Cottage on Sarles Street was also replaced after a very successful benefit fundraiser in June. Additional funds will need to be raised to replace the roof on the stable and adjoining house. The neighborhood continues to fight Mt Kisco for the preservation of the adjoining 25 acres parcel to save it from clearcutting more than 8 acres for a solar plant and cell tower only 197 feet from the historic amphitheater and Brookside Cottage. An application is in process to the State and National Registers of Historic Places Program for Brookside Cottage and the amphitheater. It has been a busy and productive year.

WESTMORELAND SANCTUARY

Westmoreland Sanctuary has been hard at work restoring riparian stream habitat in Westmoreland's Wildlife Management Area. Throughout the spring summer, and now the fall our professional staff, volunteers and interns continuously removed invasive plants. In their place, native species such as dogwood,

buttonbush, and swamp rose has been planted. Our interns engaged in research projects with the riparian stream, with a focus on conservation through a variety of disciplines: biology, geoscience, stream ecology, ornithology, and botany. We have also continued our efforts to protect our pink lady slipper population by fencing individual plants to protect them from deer herbivory. This plant is a species of special concern in NY. We have been putting equal care this summer into the restoration of Wheeler Field, cultivating plants to encourage native animal habitats. Outside our museum, we have been growing trumpet vine, violets, and mist flower to attract native pollinators, and transplanting any budded offspring to alongside our roads and trails to compete with invasive plants. Finally, we are complementing the efforts of our fieldwork with three new informational displays in our museum that engage visitors and inform them about our conservation efforts and are working on a video series to encourage visitation and stewardship.

2020-2021

POLICY 2020-2021

The By-Laws of the Bedford Garden Club, last revised in 2011, were due for a thorough review; further we needed to incorporate changes recommended by the Garden Club of America. After an in-depth examination by a group including Bedford Garden Club past Presidents, and participation by current members as well as Executive Committee members of the Bedford Garden Club, the following By-Laws changes were recommended and then ratified at the Annual Meeting in June of 2021.

- 1. In order to conform to Garden Club of America guidelines, our Photography Committee will no longer be listed as a Special Committee but as a Standing Committee of the Bedford Garden Club.
- 2. In order to address long-standing confusion about residency requirements for candidates for membership in the Bedford Garden Club, a membership clarification was made and Article VII of the By-Laws were amended to read:

Members

Admission to membership in the Club shall be limited to those owning property and residing in Northern Westchester County, or who have rented property for a minimum of two years in this area, and exhibiting strong interest in horticulture, flower arranging, or conservation and civic affairs or garden history or design.

- 3. In order to clarify the Executive Committee composition and voting rights, Virginia Maybank spearheaded a thorough review and two sections of Article VII in the Bylaws were amended.
- a) Article VII Section I was amended to read as follows:
- 1. The Executive Committee shall consist of the six officers of the Club (the Board of Directors), the Chairmen of all Standing Committees, and four members from the Club at large. In the absence of the Chairman of a Standing Committee, the Committee's Vice-Chairman shall serve. At the discretion of the President, the Chairmen of Special Committees may be invited to attend any or all Executive Committee Meetings but shall not be voting members of the Executive Committee. Subject to these By-laws and to any action taken by the members of the Club at any Annual Meeting or Special Meeting, the affairs and business of the Club, the electing of its members and the disbursements of its funds shall be in the charge of this Committee.
- b) Article VII Section 3 was amended to read as follows:
- 3. During the year, there must be a minimum of six monthly meetings of the Executive Committee, and five days' written or electronic notice shall be given to each member. Nine of its

members shall constitute a quorum. Special Meetings may be called by the President or any five members of the Committee.

4. President Nancy Kronenberg, with input from others, proposed that Letter Writing Guidelines be included in a new, special **Best Practices Addendum** to the Bedford Garden Club By-Laws. These letter writing guidelines were adopted and read as follows:

Bedford Garden Club Letter Writing Guidelines

Bedford Garden Club is encouraged by the GCA to submit letters to organizations on issues which impact the mission of the club and/or the GCA. The goal of our letter writing guidelines is to ensure that our members have an opportunity to submit and review such letters through a fair, timely, transparent and consistent process. If the letter writer so chooses, and the letter writer is encouraged to do so, they may ask the President and Chairs of the Standing Committees to review the letter prior to submitting the letter for approval by the Executive Committee. Standing Committee Chairs are expected to provide the letter writer with balanced and constructive observations. Once the letter is submitted, it is deemed to be final, and the President is expected to conduct an orderly review process. Voting members are expected to disclose any issues of personal conflict. The total letter review will not exceed 21 days.

Letter Writing Guidelines:

- 1. Submission by member(s) of final letter for consideration to the Bedford Garden Club President and Recording Secretary
- 2. President and Recording Secretary confirm conformity of letter to the Bedford Garden Club's mission.
- 3. President and Recording Secretary share the letter with the Executive Committee and the membership.
- 4. Executive Committee and Membership will respond with questions and concerns in writing to the President and Recording Secretary within 10 business days. In the event of an unpreventable timing consideration, the President may ask

- the Executive Committee for a waiver to shorten the initial time period to less than 10 days, in any event, the initial period will not be less than two days.
- 5. On the 10th day, The President and Recording Secretary will deliver the final letter and attached comment letters to the Executive Committee. A straw poll will be taken on the 11th day by the voting members of the Executive Committee. If the "straw poll" is unanimous, the letter is deemed approved and will be sent. The general membership will be informed of the delivery of the letter.
- 6. If the "straw poll" is not unanimous, the Executive Committee will have an additional 9 days to review letters before the final vote.
- 7. No later than Day 20 Final Letter is submitted to the Executive Committee and put to a vote
- 8. The Vote will take the following form:
 - A. The vote will take place no later than on Day 20. All votes will be tendered in writing to the President and Recording Secretary.
 - B. The vote is a public vote (e.g. names and votes will be disclosed to the Executive Committee after the final tally).
 - C. The majority of votes tendered will determine the outcome
 - D. The majority will be defined as 75% inclusive of votes tendered. Non-votes will be treated as abstentions.
 - E. All voting members of the Executive Committee will be required to vote on the letter (Yes, No, or Abstain).
- 9. The vote will be tallied the day after the vote or no later than Day 21 by the Recording Secretary and verified by the President.
- 10. If approved, the final letter will be shared with the general membership of the BGC and sent. If turned down, the letter will be withdrawn.

Note: The new Bedford Garden Club **Best Practices Addendum** will hold additional material of interest to our membership, as determined by our Executive Committee. Elizabeth Sachs

PROJECT REVIEW COMMITTEE

2020-2021

Despite being in a crazy, chaotic Covid-inflicted mode for almost two years, the BGC was able to receive and fund very exciting Proposals. One for the restoration and maintenance of Marsh Sanctuary submitted by Anita Stockbridge (which we granted \$1,000) and a joint-proposal "The Sunflower Project" submitted by Bedford Audubon and Hilltop Hanover Farm. (which we endowed with \$4,000) Specifically Marsh Sanctuary's 2021 Pond Side Habitat Restoration Project for the Sarles Street property has already made great strides in restoring the historic Sanctuary to its natural state by removing invasives, and planting and maintaining native plants for the long term sustainability of the area's open land, pond and stream. The grant was used to pay for paid labor as well as the purchase of native plant species as well as erecting temporary fences to protect young plants.

The Sunflower Project has been designed to both encourage local gardeners to incorporate more bird-friendly plants in their backyards but also to demonstrate to the broader community including elementary school children - that just a few seeds planted in a backyard (or school yard) can quickly produce spectacular (sometimes six foot) Sunflower beauties, increase wildlife habitat. Sunflowers are an absolute favorite food of so many of our native birds, plus, sunflowers naturally bring about greater ecological resilience to our community. In Fall 2021 Hilltop Hanover Farm plans to bring giant sunflower "heads" into the schools to demonstrate the harvesting and extraction of seeds to 3rd graders and how the "decapitated" head can be used as a "dish" of seeds. For their Projects in 2021 we wanted to underwrite "feel-good" community-based projects that were colorful and tangible, particularly during the pandemic which has been such a drain on everyone's spirits. PUBLIC RELATIONS 2020-2021

Despite the dark days of Covid still lingering throughout '20 and '21, with many activities and traditions still on hold, the Bedford Garden Club made sure not to hide its light under a bushel! In addition to the unprecedented abundance of coverage the BGC received in the GCA Bulletin this year (see separate report), we were highly active on Instagram throughout the year, engaging with our local community, historical societies, interior designers, landscape architects as well as other garden clubs. Many members shared photos of their own gardens and travels near and far and these were extremely popular on our Instagram account. We were happy and proud to post some expressions of our Club's century plus year-old mission statement: to encourage civic planting, aid in the protection of native plants and birds and stimulate the knowledge and love of gardening. To that end we enjoyed eye-catching images (which generated a ton of "likes"!) of the BGC-curated Sunken Garden at Caramoor last September, an all-club clean-up of the Sundial Garden at John Jay Homestead in April (the first time members, already vaccinated, felt confident to be mask-free outdoors!) as well as a mid-May gathering to clean up and replant at the historic Bedford Courthouse museum. We were able to share with others glimpses of our Spectacular programs courtesy of Programs Chair, Denise Santomero. Highlights included the showing of "Revolutionary Gardeners" part of The GCA Virtual Prorgrams at the Bedford Golf & Tennis Club. Through Instagram, We were able to peak into and share with the community some of Virginia Maybank's great at-home Horticulture workshops - like her Gallon Jug Greenhouses and later in April, her Bee Hotel Construction workshop. So happy to have immortalized in photographs the once-in-a-lifetime, "otherworldly" Club trip to see artist Yayoi Kusama's Cosmic Nature at the New York Botanical Garden in late May. Spectacular! BEDFORD GARDEN CLUB SCHOLARSHIPS 2020-2021

Although Covid delayed the start of Year II of our Native Plant Nursery Internship at Hilltop Hanover Farm, the project, under the direction of our Intern Emily Rauch was a great success. Beginning in the summer of 2020, our Intern targeted the production and propagation protocols of native plants, conducted community-related education and outreach, and supervised, trained and worked alongside a committed team of Native Plant Volunteers.

Emily's first priority was germinating and growing new species destined for out-planting in Hilltop Hanover Farm's seed bank and founder's plots. The effort is part of Westchester County's larger effort to conserve and restore native flora and local habitats.

Second, knowing that most homeowners prefer to plant in the spring rather than in the fall, our Intern was tasked with investigating whether tiny seedlings from 8 varieties of native species could be successfully overwintered to get a head start on production for 2021 spring sales.

Under the direction of a Professional Botanist, our Intern and her core of Native Plant Volunteers collected and propagated native plant seeds from 11 species focusing on easy-to-grow, common, attractive, deer-resistant species that will be useful to most gardeners.

Emily spent the summer refining and documenting Hilltop Hanover Farm's production protocols and created a designated nursery space outside the greenhouse, recording production schedules and timelines. Information gathered through Emily's research and observation has been formatted into species profiles essential to a Hilltop Hanover Farm Native Plant Nursery Production Manual.

Though curtailed by COVID, Ms Rauch also conducted a Community Needs Assessment, a hands-on seed collecting workshop, participated in a local seed-swap event, and directed Hilltop Hanover Farm's Native Plant Volunteer group throughout the season.

As soon as volunteers were able to safely return to Hilltop Hanover Farm, Emily began working with the Native Plant Volunteers, one day per week.

Over the 2020 season, these dedicated volunteers were responsible for the potting up of over 500 overwintered plants, transplanting over 700 plants into the field to establish seed plots, and over 5 weeks of steady effort (meeting twice a week) to collect seed heads and then thresh the seeds (dislodging the seeds from the plant).

Finally, in the Autumn of 2020, Emily, along with Hilltop Hanover Farm Director Shanyn Siegel, led a group of Bedford Garden Club members on a visit to see the seed plots, fields, and harvested seeds from the various Native Plant Projects underway at Hilltop Hanover Farm.

<u>SEEDLINGS</u> 2020-2021

In the summer of 2020 - during the height of the pandemic - the Seedling program's focus was on the *outdoors* and in the garden. The 11 Seedlings (See Seedlings Annual Report 2020) along with several knowledgeable and experienced members: Varner Redmon, Leslie Wortman and Virginia Maybank, spent time in our civic gardens (Sundial Garden at John Jay Homestead and the Court House Garden in Bedford Village) digging into these gardens' respective histories and care and maintenance. In September 2020, a Seedling Flower Arranging Workshop in the John Jay Sundial Garden was expertly organized with flair and creativity by Leslie Wortmann. In October, Virginia hosted a Seedling workshop at her home - the Seedlings spent several delightful hours in Virginia's garden learning all about dividing plants - and how easy and gratifying this important aspect of gardening really is. It was a fun and edifying summer for the new Seedlings, and in the fall and winter we encouraged the Seedlings to enjoy the wonderful virtual programs and workshops, organized by BGC Committee Heads - there was so much in which to engage. In the spring Janet Robinson Membership Chair, presented the prospective new members to

the Executive Committee who voted on their membership. The new Seedlings are:

BY-LAWS OF THE BEDFORD GARDEN CLUB, INC.

Last Revised 2021

The BEDFORD GARDEN CLUB wrote its first By-laws in 1911. It is one of the twelve Founder Clubs which in 1913 founded The Garden Club of America.

Article I <u>Name</u>

This Association shall be known as the BEDFORD GARDEN CLUB, INC.

Article II Object

The object of the Club shall be to stimulate knowledge and love of gardening among amateurs, to aid in the protection of native plants and birds, and to encourage civic planting and conservation.

Article III Directors

- 1. The control and conduct of the property and business of the Club shall be vested in a Board of Directors comprised of six members. All directors shall be elected annually by a majority vote of the members of the Club present, or by proxy, at the Annual Meeting of members, including any adjournment thereof, except that vacancies occurring during the year may be temporarily filled by the Board until the next Annual Meeting of members.
- 2. Meetings. The Board of Directors shall meet annually immediately following the Annual Meeting of Members and

- shall elect officers.* The Board of Directors shall meet at such other dates throughout the year as it may determine.
- 3. Quorum of Board of Directors. Fifty percent of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business in any meeting of the directors.

Officers

The officers of the Club shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Second Vice-President, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, and a Treasurer, who shall be elected by the Board of Directors to serve two years or until their successors are elected. Three officers, the President, First Vice-President, and Corresponding Secretary, shall be elected on the odd year; the Second Vice-President, the Recording Secretary, and the Treasurer on the even year. No President shall hold office for more than four years in succession.

Article IV President

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall be Chairman of the Executive Committee, shall appoint the Chairmen of all Committees, shall arrange for the orientation of new members, and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to her by action of the Club or the Executive Committee, and as pertain to the Office of President, including

^{*} Incorporation requires a Board of Directors. The membership elects the directors, who then elect the officers. However, the Nominating Committee, in proposing candidates for the Board, will recommend those whom they propose for specific office (to be shown in parentheses on the slate). It can be assumed that the recommendations of the membership will be followed by the Board.

The Board of Directors will consult with and work with the Executive Committee as described in our By-laws.

acting as a legal Trustee of all Club finances. The Vice-President, or in her absence the Second Vice-President, shall have all the powers and shall perform all the duties of the President in case of her absence or disability.

Article V <u>Treasurer</u>

The Treasurer shall be custodian of all funds, shall disburse all money, shall collect all dues and receive donations and income from special projects. She shall also act as a legal Trustee of all Club finances. She shall present a report at all Regular Meetings and a duly audited Annual Report at the Annual Meeting.

Article VI Secretaries

The Corresponding Secretary shall give notice of all meetings, shall conduct the correspondence of the Club and notify the Garden Club of America of any changes in membership.

The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings, and act as a legal Trustee of all Club finances.

Article VII Executive Committee

1. The Executive Committee shall consist of the six officers of the Club (the Board of Directors), the Chairmen of all Standing Committees, and four members from the Club at large. If there are co-chairmen of a Standing Committee, the co-chairmen shall jointly determine what their vote shall be. At the discretion of the President, the Chairmen of Special Committees may be invited to attend any or all Executive Committee Meetings but shall not be voting members of the Executive Committee. Subject to these By-laws and to any action taken by the members of the Club at any Annual or Special Meeting, the

affairs and business of the Club, the electing of its members and the disbursement of its funds shall be in charge of this Committee.

- 2. The four members from the Club at large shall be elected at the Annual Meeting to serve for one year only, or until their successors are elected.
- 3. During the year, there must be a minimum of six monthly meetings of the Executive Committee, and five days' written or electronic notice shall be given to each member. Nine of its members shall constitute a quorum. Special Meetings may be called by the President or any five members of the Committee.
- 4. The Executive Committee or the President shall submit at each regular meeting of the Club a short report of the affairs of the Club, or such report as the Club may direct.
- 5. The Board of Directors shall have power, in case of a vacancy in any office provided for under Article III or in the elected membership of the Executive Committee, to fill the vacancy for the unexpired term.
- 6. Any member, who has special business she may wish to present to the Executive Committee, is privileged to bring it before a meeting of the Executive Committee, after having notified the Corresponding Secretary of her intention.
- 7. The Executive Committee shall have power to deal with all infringements of the rules of the Club.
- 8. (a) An officer of the Club who shall be absent for three successive meetings without providing a report or explanation satisfactory to the Executive Committee shall be deemed to have resigned.
 - (b) If a Standing Committee is not represented at three successive meetings by a Chairman or Vice-Chairman or by a

report of the Committee presented by the Secretary, the Chairman of such Committee shall have deemed to have resigned.

- (c) A member at large must present an explanation satisfactory to the Executive Committee for her absence from three successive meetings.
- 9. Order of business for the Executive Committee shall be as follows:
 - Minutes of the Committee.
 - Treasurer's Report.
 - Reports of both Secretaries.
 - Reports of Standing Committees.
 - Election of new members.
 - Reports of Special Committees.
 - Unfinished business.
 - New business.

Article VIII Nominating Committee

- 1. This Committee shall consist of five members. The Chairman shall be appointed in October by the President in consultation with the Executive Committee. Two members shall be appointed from the Executive Committee and three from the Club at large. The Chairman will become a member of the Executive Committee. She and her committee will serve for that calendar year.
- 2. The Committee shall nominate a ticket of candidates for the Board of Directors and four members at large and shall notify the Corresponding Secretary, who shall mail a list of candidates so nominated to each member of the Club at least ten days before the Annual Meeting. This committee may also assist the President or President-elect in appointments of all Standing and Special Committees.

Article IX Custodian

There will be a Custodian, appointed by the President, whose duties it shall be to have the care and custody of all files, records and archives and all other properties of the Club (except funds and securities) when turned over to her by the Officers and Chairmen of Committees.

Article X Standing Committees

The Chairman of each Standing Committee shall be appointed by the President as soon as may be after the Annual Meeting and announced at the next regular meeting of the members. The members of each Standing Committee shall be appointed by the Chairman of such Committee after consultation with the President.

There shall be the following Standing Committees:

- 1. Program It shall be the duty of this Committee to arrange programs for all meetings covering and consistent with the work and interests of the Standing Committees, and other interests and projects of the Club, to arrange dates and places of meetings subject to the approval of the Executive Committee, and to prepare notices of meetings for the Corresponding Secretary three weeks in advance.
- 2. Membership It shall be the duty of this Committee to receive the names of candidates for membership, to pass on the eligibility of the candidates and to present their names to the Executive Committee, and to inform the Treasurer and Corresponding Secretary of any changes in membership.
- 3. Exhibitions (Known as Flower Show by GCA). It shall be the duty of this Committee to be responsible for flower arranging and for providing workshops for the members. There shall be at least one exhibition each year.

- 4. Conservation and Civic Affairs It shall be the duty of this Committee to encourage the wise and sound management of our natural resources both locally and nationally; to encourage the setting aside and maintenance of natural areas; to stimulate an interest in conservation in the community; to promote interest in community improvement and to work to preserve the integrity, stability and beauty of this area.
- 5. Horticulture It shall be the duty of this Committee to stimulate the knowledge and love of horticulture among the members; to institute courses in horticulture for members, and to cooperate with local horticulture programs.
- 6. Garden History and Design it shall be the duty of this Committee to educate the Members about American landscape and garden design, to demonstrate how American Garden history is and has always been an integral part of the cultural and social life of the communities in which these gardens exist, and to continue to add to the GCA Collection at the Archives of American Gardens by researching, documenting and photographing important American gardens past and present, large and small, simple or complex, classical or vernacular.
- 7. Photography It shall be the duty of this committee to further the knowledge and love of gardening and the natural landscape through photography and to promote the art and science of photography at all skill levels through education.

Article XI Meetings

1. Annual Meeting – The Club shall hold an Annual Meeting of the members for the election of Directors and the four members of the Executive Committee from the Club at large and for the

transaction of such other business as may come before the meeting. This meeting shall be held in June at such date, hour and place as may be designated by the Board of Directors. Order of business for the Annual Meeting shall be as follows:

Minutes of last Annual Meeting.

Treasurer's Report.

Reports of both secretaries.

Reports of Standing Committees.

Reports of such special Committees as may be designated by the President.

Unfinished business.

President's Report.

Report of the Nominating Committee.

Election of Board of Directors and Members at Large.

Nominations from the floor may precede the elections and a plurality of votes shall elect.

New business.

2. Regular Meetings – A minimum of seven Regular Meetings shall be held each year. The places and the dates proposed by the Program Committee shall be approved by the Executive Committee.

Order of Business for Regular Meetings shall be as follows:

Minutes of last meeting.

Treasurer's Report.

Any reports at the direction of the President.

3. At least ten days' written or electronic notice shall be given each member of all meetings except Special Meetings.

- 4. Special Meetings Special Meetings may be called by the President or at the written request of any five members, sent to the Corresponding Secretary, stating the object for which such meeting is called. The Corresponding Secretary shall notify all members in writing of the date and object of such meeting, giving not less than three days' notice, and no other business than that stated in the notice shall be transacted at a Special Meeting.
- 5. Twenty-five members shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the Club.
- 6. Our Club depends on the active participation of its membership. Members are expected to attend the monthly meetings and to be active in the Standing Committee of their choosing. Members are asked to support and respect the work of their fellow members who organize and plan for each Bedford Garden Club event. In the instance where it is not possible to attend meetings on a regular basis, members are asked to contribute to the Club in ways that will be mutually beneficial.

Article XII Members

- 1. Admission to membership in the Club shall be limited to those owning property and residing in Northern Westchester County, or who have rented property for a minimum of two years in this area, and exhibiting a strong interest in horticulture, flower arranging, or conservation and civic affairs or garden history and design.
- 2. The total membership excluding Affiliate Members shall not exceed our quota of 125 members of which the total of Associate Members shall not exceed 25 and the combined total of Active and Sustaining Members shall not exceed 100.
- 3. There shall be four classes of membership:

- a. Active Members. This category constitutes the working members of the Club. They shall attend meetings regularly, serve on committees, and take part in the projects of the Club.
- b. Associate Members. Associate Members shall have full privileges of the Club, including the power of voting. Their attendance at the Regular Meetings and participation in any active work of the Club is optional. This category of membership shall not exceed 25 in number and shall be limited to any member who has served as a President of the Bedford Garden Club and/or has served on the zone or national level of the GCA.
- c. Sustaining Members. Members who have completed fifteen years of satisfactory service and who are no longer desirous or able to participate in our Club's activities, are eligible for this membership at the discretion of the Executive Committee. These members shall have the privileges offered by the Garden Club of America. They may attend meetings of the Bedford Garden Club and elect to chair a committee, vote or hold an office if they desire.
- d. Affiliate Members. Affiliate Membership may be granted upon request to any member in good standing who has moved to another area.
 - 1. An Affiliate member may not represent her Club as a delegate of a Zone or Annual Meeting.
 - 2. The Bedford Garden Club Affiliate Member is an active member of The Garden Club of America and shall have the privileges offered by the Garden Club of America. The Affiliate Member may attend Bedford Garden Club functions but may not vote, chair any committee or hold office.

Article XIII New Members

- 1. The first step in proposing a new member is to contact the Membership Committee Chairman who will explain the procedure.
- 2. A candidate of membership shall be proposed and seconded in writing by members of the Club. The letters of the proposer and seconder together with three letters from members by whom the candidate is well known shall be sent to the Chairman of the Membership Committee. Those on the Membership Committee may not write these recommendations.
- 3. A member may propose only one and second only one candidate for membership and may write only three endorsing letters during a Club year. A member may not write for a relative for membership in the Club. A member may not propose, second or endorse names for membership until she herself has been a member for six months.
- 4. Candidates shall be considered by the Membership Committee in the order of the submission of their names together with the letters of their proposers, seconders and three endorsing letters as above provided, and no candidate shall be considered until all the requirements of this By-law shall have been complied with.
- 5. Former members and children of former or present members whose names are proposed for membership shall be considered prior to other candidates. Former members who desire to be reinstated need only be proposed and seconded in writing by members. The six Officers and those on the Membership Committee may not write these recommendations. Reinstated members shall have the original date of membership, resignation and reentry listed in the Yearbook.

- 6. Candidates duly proposed and presented as provided for above shall be voted on by the Executive Committee for admission to the Club. Voting shall be by secret ballot. Two adverse votes shall exclude.
- 7. Active Members are expected to serve on at least one of the following committees: Horticulture, Exhibitions, or Conservation and Civic Affairs or Garden History and Design unless excused by the Executive Committee for extenuating circumstances.
- 8. In conformity with the Garden Club of America policy regarding dual membership, incoming members of the Bedford Garden Club shall not hold membership in two Garden Club of America's Clubs situated in one locality.

Article XIV Resignation

Resignation from membership shall be made to the Membership Chairman in writing.

Article XV Annual Dues

Dues are subject to change at the discretion of the Executive Committee and the Garden Club of America.

All dues include the dues of the Garden Club of America. All members who shall have failed to pay these dues within a month of the second notice shall cease to be members of the Club, except as provided under Article VII, Section 7.

Article XVI Guests

Members may bring their house guests to any meeting of the Club except Annual or Special Meetings. Persons living in the page 105E

neighborhood who are not members of the Bedford Garden Club are not entitled to attend meetings except with the approval of the Membership Chairman and the President. The Hostess should be consulted when a meeting is held in a member's house.

Article XVII Amendments

These By-laws may be amended at an Annual or Special Meeting by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting. No amendment shall be considered unless the Corresponding Secretary shall have mailed or electronically mailed a copy thereof to each member of the Club at least ten days before the meeting.

Article XVIII <u>Disposition of Funds</u>

No part of the assets of the Club shall inure to the benefit of any member of the Club. In the event of the dissolution of the Club, all remaining funds shall be turned over to the Garden Club of America.

Article XIX Policy

Any service rendered to the Club by a member should be provided at cost with no profit to that member.

The Bedford Garden Club Executive Decisions

5/1/2021 - Letter Writing Guidelines

Bedford Garden Club is encouraged by the GCA to submit letters to organizations on issues which impact the mission of the club and/or the GCA. The goal of our letter writing guidelines is to ensure that our members have an opportunity to submit and review such letters through a fair, timely, transparent and consistent process. If the letter writer so chooses and the letter writer is encouraged to do so, they may ask the President and Chairs of the Standing Committees to review the letter prior to submitting the letter for approval by the Executive Committee. Standing Committee Chairs are expected to provide the letter writer with balanced and constructive observations. Once the letter is submitted, it is deemed to be final, and the President is expected to conduct an orderly review process. Voting members are expected to disclose any issues of personal conflict. The total letter review will not exceed 21 days.

Letter Writing Guidelines:

- **1.** Submission by member(s) of final letter for consideration to the Bedford Garden Club President and Recording Secretary
- **2.** President and Recording Secretary confirm conformity of letter to the Bedford Garden Club's mission.
- **3.** President and Recording Secretary share the letter with the Executive Committee and the membership.
- **4.** Executive Committee and Membership will respond with questions and concerns in writing to the President and Recording Secretary within 10 business days. In the event of an unpreventable timing consideration, the President may ask the Executive Committee for a waiver to shorten the initial time period to less than 10 days, in any event, the initial period will not be less than two days.
- **5.** On the 10th day, The President and Recording Secretary will deliver the final letter and attached comment letters to the

Executive Committee. A straw poll will be taken on the 11th day by the voting members of the Executive Committee. If the "straw poll" is unanimous, the letter is deemed approved and will be sent. The general membership will be informed of the delivery of the letter.

- **6.** If the "straw poll" is not unanimous, the Executive Committee will have an additional 9 days to review letters before the final vote.
- 7. No later than Day 20 Final Letter is submitted to the Executive Committee and put to a vote
- **8**. The Vote will take the following form:
- A. The vote will take place no later than on Day 20. All votes will be tendered in writing to the President and Recording Secretary.
- B. The vote is a public vote (e.g. names and votes will be disclosed to the Executive Committee after the final tally).
- C. The majority of votes tendered will determine the outcome
- D. The majority will be defined as 75% inclusive of votes tendered. Non-votes will be treated as abstentions.
- E. All voting members of the Executive Committee will be required to vote on the letter (Yes, No, or Abstain).
- **9**. The vote will be tallied the day after the vote or no later than Day 21 by the Recording Secretary and verified by the President.
- **10**. If approved, the final letter will be shared with the general membership of the BGC and sent. If turned down, the letter will be withdrawn.
- **2/6/1991** A motion passed that the BGC would phase out its Honorary Membership because of the difficulty in deciding on eligibility. When there are no longer any members in this category, the By-laws would be changed to reflect this policy.
- **2/2/1989** Vote on granting a leave of absence to a member who is coping with a major illness in her family.

1/4/1989 - Explanation of Club's longstanding policy that we do not, as a club, send flowers at the time of a member's death.

9/7/1988 - Decision made to set aside \$200/year to save toward the printing of our next History. This item should be budgeted each year. Passed 10/5/88.

7/2/1986 - The Jean Newell Memorial Fund originated as a 1971 bequest of \$6000 to the Bedford Garden Club in 1971 for the purpose of the Friendship Gardens at the Bedford Hills Correctional Facility, or should they cease, for other worthwhile civic projects. The Friendship Gardens project begun in 1958 ended in 1976. The accumulated interest from this fund was used for the John Jay Sun Dial Garden and twice was borrowed as seed money for the Caramoor Flower Show benefits. In these instances, the funds were repaid to the Newell Fund.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF HOSTESSES

- (1) It is the responsibility of the Chairman of Hostesses to appoint a Head Hostess and four co-hostesses for each Garden Club meeting, in addition to the member in whose house the meeting is held.
 - (a) In the event that the appointed Head Hostess cannot fulfill her responsibilities, she is expected to get a replacement and report the change to the Chairman of Hostesses at least two months before her assigned meeting.
 - (b) The Head Hostess and her co-hostesses make and work out all details and arrangements involving hospitality for the meeting and tea.
 - (c) The Head Hostess should confer first with the member in whose house the meeting is being held to ascertain what will be needed in the way of chairs, coat racks, flowers, food, china, silver, direction signs, parking attendant and table for the President.
 - (d) The Head Hostess then makes arrangements with her co-hostesses to work out details and decide what will be provided for refreshments. She contacts the Treasurer for money from the Hostess Fund, which is provided through the dues, as an assessment of \$5 per member.
 - (e) The Head Hostess should contact the Corresponding Secretary a few days before the meeting to find out how many acceptances have been received. She should not purchase any plastic cups, napkins, plates, etc., until our supply is exhausted. The Custodian is in charge of these items as well as the large coffee and hot water (for tea) pots, which are needed upon occasions.

- (2) Co-hostesses may be asked to come the morning of the meeting to help set up chairs or to stay after the meeting to help the hostess put her house back in order.
 - (a) If a co-hostess is unable to fulfill her responsibilities, she is to get a substitute and report the change to her Head Hostess at least two months before her assigned meeting.
- (3) Flower arrangements are the responsibility of the hostesses. If the help of the Flower Arranging Committee is desired, it should be requested in plenty of time.
- (4) All members are asked in turn to be hostesses and it is hoped that all meeting and tea arrangements will be kept as simple as possible.
- (5) During their term of office, the President, two Secretaries, Treasurer and Chairmen of Civic Affairs and Conservation, Flower Arranging, Horticulture and Programs will be excluded from being asked to be hostesses.
