<u>CIVIC AFFAIRS AND CONSERVATION</u> 2019-2020

Films

Fantastic Fungi (October 13, 2019)

This film was an inspiring and soul-touching journey into the mysterious subterranean world of mycelium and its fruit, the mushroom. For the past 3.5 billion years, fungi have made the soil that supports life with its mycelial networks that connect vast systems of roots from plants and trees all over the planet, like an underground internet.

The Pollinators (Nov 5, 2019)

The screening of *The Pollinators*, was sponsored by Bedford 2020 in partnership with the Bedford Garden Club, Rusticus Garden Club and Healthy Yards. Following the film, there was a panel discussion moderated by Kim Eierman, Founder of EcoBeneficial, an Environmental Horticulturist specializing in ecological landscapes and native plants. Panelists included *The Pollinators* director, Peter Nelson, and Jack Algiere, Farm Director at Stone Barns Center for Food and Agriculture.

Programs

Doug Tallamy (October 17, 2019)

BGC joined with Rusticus to sponsor a lecture by Doug Tallamy, professor of entomology at University of Delaware and author of *Bringing Nature Home* and *The Living Landscape*.

Workshops

Jim Nordgren (September 23, 2019)

Environmental consultant, Jim Nordgren, led a workshop at the home of Jayni Chase to identify invasive plants and address ways of eradicating them.

Rod Christie (October 22, 2019)

Executive Director of the Mianus River Gorge Preservation, Rod Christie, led us on a walk in the Gorge. He discussed "Revitalization of the Eastern Forest: Rebuilding Tree Health, Wildflower Diversity and Forest Resiliency."

iNaturalist Workshop (April 21, 2020)

Following Jayni's attendance of an event at the home of Bedford resident Murray Fisher, founder of the NY Harbor School and Billion Oyster Project to showcase the new app **iNaturalist**, Jayni organized a Zoom workshop for BGC members. Murray taught the group how to use the i**Naturalist** app in order identify insects on individuals' properties with the goal of developing an inventory of Bedford insects. We were asked to download the app and take photos of insect life on our properties or those of our neighbors that would be then be identified by experts on the app and included in a Bedford biodiversity project.

Veggie Garden Workshop (May 7 & 8, 2020)

The Conservation Committee invited master gardener Annie Farrell to give a two day Zoom workshop on Vegetable Gardening – site selection, raised beds, planting tips, companion gardening, soil quality, keeping out critters, beneficial insects, and much more!

Zone III Veggie Garden Workshop (June 4 & 5, 2020)

Annie Farrell's Workshop for BGC was such a success, Conservation Committee contacted our Zone III Chair, Andrea Stewart, who agreed to let us invite all Zone III clubs to a similar two day Zoom Workshop. Eleven clubs and 55 GCA Zone III members participated in the workshops.

Projects

Civic Project to Support Local Newspaper, Record Review

During COVID shutdowns our local newspapers suffer from reduced advertising revenue. Since the Record Review is the backbone of our community, the BGC resolved to generate revenue by paying for a full page color ad to showcase the role of the Record Review in our community and to educate all readers about the "Good Bugs of Bedford," encouraging our neighbors not to use broad-spectrum pesticides that devastate insects and the birds, frogs, reptiles and mammals that survive on them.

Cary Institute Seed Propagation

Bedford Garden Club has been working with Bedford 2020 on a project to plant a pollinator habitat beneath a new ground-mounted solar array being built at the Cary Institute in Poughkeepsie, New York. Ron Bowen, Founder and President of Prairie Restoration, was hired to prepare the 5-acre site and do the seeding. At the time of seeding, we planned to plant over 2000 plugs to accompany the seeds. The plugs were grown from seed by Virginia Maybank of BGC and Jack Algierre, Farm Director at Stone Barns Center for Food and Agriculture. While the plugs were successfully germinated, Cary Institute remained closed due to COVID. Happily, Stone Barns is planting their plugs (approximately 1600) and Jayni Chase and Ellen Conrad have planted approximately 350 of Virginia's plugs. The goal is to plant them on the Cary site in the fall, when we expect Cary to reopen and seeding to take place.

Photography/Hort/Conservation Project

This year the three committees joined forces to encourage members to take photos of pollinators, native plants, invasives and young trees being grown from small saplings. The goal was to follow up with photography workshops, and educational captions from Hort and Conservation. We hope to follow up in 2020 to accomplish these goals.

<u>SANCTUARIES</u>

2019-2020

AUDUBON SANCTUARIES: While Bedford Audubon was started in 1913, it wasn't until 2001 that it got its current home at Bylane Farm, generously donated by the family of BGC member Mary Welsh Parker. Bylane Farm itself, dating from the early 1700's, is an historical treasure that now uses water- and energy- efficient practices and eco-friendly materials to reduce its ecological footprint. Bylane Farm hosts the offices, conference and meeting space for Bedford Audubon, and the John L. Bull Library of books, manuscripts, and paintings, as well as housing for their Naturalist-in-Residence, seasonal staff and interns, and visiting researchers and speakers.

Today, Bylane Farm is the center of Bedford Audubon operations, co-located with the Leon Levy Native Garden and the Hunt-Parker Sanctuary, located in Bedford and Lewisboro totaling 338 acres and 5 miles of trails. Hunt-Parker is considered the crown jewel sanctuary in Bedford Audubon's network as it is their largest sanctuary. Another significant sanctuary is the Ruth Walgreen Franklin & Winifred Fels Sanctuary in North Salem, with 204 acres and 3 miles of trails. Further, Bedford Audubon is responsible for the regular oversight of the Rose & Rockshelter Preserve and the Pine Croft Meadow Preserve owned by the Westchester Land Trust and the O'Donohue Preserve owned by the North Salem Open Land Foundation.

While we as a club were unable to visit Bedford Audubon this year, many of our members make regular visits and partake of the interesting and varied programs Bedford Audubon at Bylane Farm offers.

MARSH SANCTUARY: In the fall of 2019, the Marsh Sanctuary started a relationship with the Rewilding School which is now regularly using our grounds for their programs: connecting kids and adults with the outdoors through our year-round programs in wilderness skills and crafts, archery, foraging and more.

The Marsh Community Garden is thriving. The garden plots are fully booked and well-tended. The sharing garden has been reborn and is regularly contributing to the Mt. Kisco Food Pantry. Pumping equipment to move water from the pond to the holding tank next to the garden is being upgraded.

The Sanctuary grounds and trails are very well maintained, and have been especially busy. We appreciate the work of our naturalist Jason Garritt and our maintenance head Antonio Monroy. The Keesee family has donated a wonderful bench in memory of Pat. It has been placed to overlook the pond.

We are having long deferred construction work done to the historic Brookside property. A new fence is being installed along South Bedford Road. Outside windows and doors in the Brookside house will be replaced over a period of years as we can afford them. Many thanks to Casey Brooks for his help on these projects.

MIANUS RIVER GORGE PRESERVE:

Rod Christie and the Gorge have been busy according to Kristin Winters.

The Gorge continues this year with its restoration garden which represents 27 different species to date. Last year thousands of seeds representing four species were planted back into the Gorge to increase the genetic diversity in the forest.

MIANUS RIVER GORGE completed its work to inoculate 2000 Eastern Hemlock trees against the hemlock wooly adelgid and Hemlock scale. Also the Gorge is establishing a population of the laricobius nigrinus beetle which feeds on the hemlock wooly adelgid. Another project of MIANUS RIVER GORGE is to restore the biodiversity of three different meadows to support pollinators, birds and other wildlife species.

TEATOWN RESERVATION: The Bedford Garden Club no longer supports this reservation. It is beyond the Bedford area.

WESTMORELAND SANCTUARY

Fall and winter of 2019 and 2020 saw Westmoreland Sanctuary continue its reknown quality environmental education programs through schools, scouts, and camps. The floral arranging programs continued to produce a loyal and growing group of participants. These programs combine the use of invasive species with typical seasonal materials in thematic events.

The Educational Department developed a new pre-k curriculum with an emphasis on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) during fall and winter. Curriculum support is being facilitated through the production of new center exhibits designed to be used as teaching tools for educational programming. These exhibits will have the additional asset of educating the visiting public with tactile components and a focus on place-based content.

The educational programing came to a standstill. However, the mild late winter and early spring did allow for conservation work. Fields were moved and expanded. Amphibian breeding pools were more closely monitored than previously. Pink Ladyslipper patches were completely protected with individual cloches to prevent deer damage and leaf buildup. Education staff started transitioning to more virtual programming.

The COVID-19 crisis brought an estimated 3 times as many daily visitors to the Sanctuary trail system. Unfortunately, it also resulted in the New York/New Jersey Trail Conference pausing their trail work. Westmoreland staff stepped in to take over trail duties by picking up trash, clearing downed trees and branches, and remarking trails.

Westmoreland staff also developed a greeter service to assist visitors at the trailhead for a more enjoyable experience.

As New York State started to reopen, Westmoreland was one of the only local institutions that was capable of supporting High School Senior Internships given because of our outdoor classroom. 3 high school seniors helped with trail work, conservation, and animal care. Westmoreland was also able to facilitate its summer camp programs on a smaller scale and its summer college internship program, as well.

Summer conservation work consisted of a special riparian area project in which college interns and high school and college volunteers test water quality, remove invasive plants and crayfish, plant native shrubs and trees. This project is designed to maintain the potable water and its keystone species, the brook trout, from the effects of climate change. It is estimated that they removed over 2,000 lbs of invasive plants.

Also, of note is the infrastructure work conducted during this time. A rebuilt and improved Sugaring Lean-To and Pond Teaching Shed were completed.

Bedford Garden Club Summer Internship 2019

Due to the generous grant from Bedford Garden Club, Westmoreland Sanctuary was able to provide summer internships to two college students, Erin Kincade and Matthew Bronico. Erin's main project was to establish a protocol for our bird banding operation and a bird banding educational power point for increasing number of high school science classes visiting Westmoreland Sanctuary. The bird banding protocol will be integrated into Westmoreland's Natural Resources Management Plan (NRMP). Matthew Bronico's project was to research and establish an Eastern Coyote management policy for Westmoreland Sanctuary. This research will also be integrated into Westmoreland's Natural Resources Management Plan (NRMP). Matt's work has helped establish our current coyote management policy and reflects the positive influence these animals have on our property. The work also will be utilized to help educate the public and our visitors regarding coyotes and how to alleviate fears and avoid potential conflicts.

National Affairs & Legislation

The annual meeting was held in Washington, DC on Feb 23-26, 2020 Bills before Congress that have either been recently passed or are up for votes:

OCEANS:

- The GCA believes we should protect our coastal areas and oceans from all signs of pollution and environmental degradation, including plastic and marine debris.
- The Senate unanimously supported the passage of the Save Our Seas legislation.
- We requested support for the companion bill in the House.
- The bill proposed a variety of new measures to bolster international engagement and cooperation to research and address the marine debris crisis.
- **In meeting with our Congressman's aide we learned that Mr. Maloney was unaware of this bill. We urged his aide to bring it to Maloney's attention and ask him to support it.

TRANSPORTATION, INFRASTRUCTURE AND POLLINATOR HIGHWAYS ACT (ATIA)

- The GCA strongly supports provisions in the ATIA that address climate change and require transportation projects to use native plants and natural infrastructure.
- We asked our senators and congressman to retain provisions to address climate change, combat invasive species and require use of native plants and natural infrastructure.
- We also requested that they support the Monarch and Pollinator Highway Act of 2019. This bipartisan bill would establish a grant program to benefit and assure that any transportation bill passing the Senate includes specifically the words "climate change". Similarly we asked Mr. Maloney to support the inclusions of these provisions in any transportation bill passing the House.
- In each of our meetings when asking what we could do to help pass any of these bills, the answer was always, speak to Mitch McConnell.

LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION FUND

- GCA supports efforts to protect, enhance and expand public lands for the benefit of all citizens.
- GCA is seeking the permanent and full funding at \$900M per year. In FY 2020 LWCF only received \$495M short of the \$900M promised when it was established in 1965.
- Senate unanimously supported this bill last year. We were requesting support in the house

PARKS, PUBLIC LANDS AND NATIVE PLANTS

- For more than a century GCA has supported the protection, repair and enhancement of our national parks and public lands.
- These bills have strong bi-partisan support, which will direct \$6.5 million annually toward critical maintenance of roads, trails, visitor centers etc. This amount is only a portion of the \$11 billion backlog of repairs needed.
- To date Senator Schumer had not signed onto this bill but Senator Gilibrand was supporting it.

THE GREAT AMERICAN OUTDOOR ACT

- When we returned home these two bills became a new bill, which combines LWCF and the Restore our Parks Act.
- This newly formed bill dedicates \$9.5 billion over five years from energy receipts to make much needed infrastructure repairs on lands managed by the National Park Service, US Fish and Wildlife Service, US Forest Service
- This bill also dedicated \$900 million annually to LWCF
- Senator Gillibrand has co-signed the bill but Senator Schumer had not. When we met with his aide, Sean Byrne, he said Senator Schumer was supportive, but we needed him to sign on ASAP.
- Those of us who had attended NAL wrote emails to our Senators asking them to cosponsor or support The Great American Outdoors Act.
- The Zone III attendees addressed our email directly to Sean Byrne asking for Senator Schumer to promptly cosponsor the newly combined bill.

HORTICULTURE 2019-2020

This has been a scary and uncertain time for people everywhere. In Bedford, members of the Garden Club have taken comfort and respite by working on our land while we shelter in place with our families at home. This spring has brought long weeks of cold, wet weather making a challenge of the traditional, seasonal gardening activities. We look forward to safely gathering together again before too long.

The Horticulture Committee kicked off with our annual seed starting workshop in September. Without the need to grow submissions for a Zone Meeting (which now take place in alternate years), we explored a variety of techniques including a few old wives' methods like using a potato for starting media and putting rosemary cuttings in green glass containers. We home-brewed rooting compound by steeping willow leaves in boiled water.

Our second workshop took us to visit Bear Creek Farm in Stamfordville, New York where we had a tour, lunch and lecture with the owner, Debra Kaye, a renowned grower of extraordinary dahlias. We learned about her novel cultivation practices like hilling up over the planted tubers, trialing efforts with new varieties of cut flowers and received helpful lists of native flowering plants for starting our own cutting gardens. It was an added bonus to have our Zone Rep join the trip!

Last year the Horticulture Committee mounted a successful, full-fledged Holiday Boutique in conjunction with our Greens Day community wreath-making meeting in November. Their efforts were very well received!

In January, the Horticulture Committee hosted a houseplant care and propagation workshop. Former Club President Nancy Vincent brought her ultra-vigorous streptocarpus plants for us to propagate by division and leaf cuttings. We also offered all the equipment needed for attendees who wanted to try the GCA's recommendations for snow sowing in plastic jugs.

Horticulture and Floral Design hosted a Bench Class Flower Show in February under the guidance of Wendy Cushman, formerly Exhibitions Chair. The Horticulture schedule featured houseplant classes for topiary and a come one/come all group described as Par, under which heading, exhibitors were invited to bring cuttings of anything either green or in bloom in early spring from their gardens.

The Bedford Garden Club has entered the modern age with a public Instagram account. So far this year, Horticulture has submitted several posts about the activities described above as well as beautiful results of the snow drop workshop we hosted last year. Just under the wire, before we all holed up in our respective houses and yards to combat the Covid-19 pandemic, we had a very successful Mushroom Growing workshop. Denise Santomero volunteered to co-host the event and we invited her gardener, a mushroom expert, who gave a wonderful talk about identifying mushrooms in the wild. Denise created photo blow ups of the most easily identifiable varieties foragers would be likely to encounter locally in Bedford. Nearly a dozen members attended and learned how to grow Wine Cap mushrooms outdoors, 'lasagna style.' Two 'vintages' of aged wood chips as well as a straw/hay mix to use for layering were provided for take away. Seeded with Stropharia rugosa annular spawn, ordered from Field & Forest Products, beds created by members at their homes should produce edible mushrooms this year!

By March both the GCA and the BGC began cancelling future events. The February Mushroom Workshop was one of the last official BGC meetings for our calendar year. Our May Plant Exchange meeting was called off. The second Bench Class Flower Show, originally scheduled to coincide with our annual meeting in June, was postponed until next fall.

PROGRAMS 2019-2020

We began in September with a spectacular talk on Persian gardens by Stephen Byrnes, President of Untermyer Gardens Conservancy, which is well established as one of the most splendid Islamic gardens in America. American treasure.") By March, our programs and club had been shut down due to the danger of contracting the Chinese Coronavirus.

However, before all went to enjoy solo our own gardens for early spring work, we launched a Garden Film Festival at the Bedford Playhouse, premiering in October - to a sold-out audience! - with the cult hit film "Fantastic Fungi" aka "the mushroom movie." We continued with what turned out to be a popular idea in February with "A Little Chaos" about two talented landscape artists who become romantically entangled while building a garden in King Louis XIV's palace at Versailles (starring Kate Winslet); followed by 'This Beautiful Fantastic' in March about a young woman who dreams of being a children's author while making an unlikely friendship with a cantankerous, rich old widower gardener; and lastly in April "Greenfingers," based on a true story, about a prison inmate with a green thumb who, with the help of his new found garden club friend, competes in a national gardening competition.

We have four Garden Club of America Awards:

The first GCA award is GCA Medal of Merit.

GCA Medal of Merit will be awarded to a BGC member at the Annual Meeting on September 23rd. It's very exciting but very confidential! We will have an insert for our yearbook as an "Addendum" at that time.

The GCA Club Horticulture Commendation is awarded to one or more individuals, or an organization, not members of a GCA club, which have made a significant contribution to conservation in their community.

For more than a century the Bedford Audubon Society has demonstrated outstanding leadership in advancing and protecting our natural world. A notable and thriving partnership between the Bedford Garden Club and the Bedford Audubon Society (BAS) dates back decades. Early on in our history some of the Bedford Audubon lands were gifted by a generous Bedford Garden Club member. In the seventies the two organizations partnered to address the serious health problems of DDT.

Through their programs in conservation, research, and education, the Bedford Audubon Society has served as exceptional stewards of the environment, promoting the kindred goals and mission of the Bedford Garden club. Confident of their important educational role, the Bedford Garden Club has sponsored internships and conducted educational programs for members of the Bedford community. Nature in all its forms is currently threatened and thus plaudits for the society's exceptional service are in order.

Our long partnership, including current initiatives in the research and propagation of native plants has advanced the goals of habitat preservation and wildlife protection so urgently needed today. More recently in the challenged environment of the pandemic, we applaud the generosity of Bylane Farm/Bedford Audubon Society in opening their trails to the community for much needed safe, outdoor recreation. Further to their educational mission, the BAS instituted a virtual book club and other welcome outdoor programs to engage its constituents.

One more time the work of these honorees shows how our club members continuously give traditional arts and goals a new and more current twist.

Various members submitted garden images to be posted: photographer extraordinaire Anita Stockbridge shared regal monarch caterpillars, Denise Santomero here supermodel-calibre specimen chickens aka Her Resident Tick Control! Tina Winchester shared baby Nigella she'd planted in the mini greenhouse she made in then Horticulture Chair Robin Ashley's propagation workshop in February. Also in later in February, members Deirdre Glascott, Anita Stockbridge and Diane Lewis joining 300 activists, ventured to Capitol Hills and NAL 2020 to advocate for environmental causes, members.

BEDFORD GARDEN CLUB SCHOLARSHIPS

2019-2020

As Scholarship Chair of the Bedford Garden Club I am delighted to report that our 2020 Native Plant-focused Internship is fully underway at Hilltop Hanover Farm (HHF). The Internship has been specially created to enable HHF to conduct critical research in formalizing native plant propagation and production protocols, as well as assist in community-related education, outreach and volunteer training activities.

To date, under the supervision of our BGC Intern, three 200' Seed Plots have been planted with 6 different native plant species using a variety of germination and propagation protocols, and an active plant Nursery with 4 varieties of native specimens has also been established for sale to local gardeners and gardening groups in HHF's online and farm stand store (500 in quart size and 500 in gallon size containers). In addition to carefully documenting the ongoing plant research, our Intern is creating a Native Plant Cultivation Manual for Westchester Gardeners and is overseeing a small group* of Volunteers (*following best practices during Covid, only 3 Volunteers are on site at any given time).

Our Intern is also meeting, virtually, with an extensive list of Westchester groups involved with Native Plant distributions to determine the variety, number and ideal container sizes needed for next summer.

A special BGC on-site visit to meet our Intern and Hilltop Hanover Farm Director Shanyn Siegel is being scheduled for the fall. Elizabeth Sachs

IN MEMORIUM

Helen Walker Parker Born August 17, 1930

Died February 14, 2020

Helen Parker (Mrs. Foxhall A) died on February 14, 2020 having served as the Bedford Garden Club's president from 1979 to 1983 and been a club member for 62 years.

During her double term Helen worked tirelessly on several fronts: assuring the Club's financial stability during a period of high inflation, returning the Club to yearly major flower shows (at Caramoor each June) and continuing the restoration of the John Jay Homestead Sun Dial Garden. Her devoted and focused efforts also occurred during the year-long Garden Club involvement with the town of Bedford's Tricentennial celebration (in May, 1980) when most members were already busy - but Helen never took "no" for an answer when asking members to fill volunteer positions!

When it came to protecting the financial health of the Club, Helen's creativity came to the fore. One cool autumn morning early in her tenure a caravan of Garden Club ladies in their family station wagons traversed highways and byways to a New Jersey wholesaler who sold plants to retailers at great profit. One can imagine Helen negotiating a superior deal to pick up carloads of chrysanthemums at a discount for sale to Bedford Garden Club members and their friends. The endeavor proved lucrative and highly successful as a much needed fund raiser.

After her four-year term ended, Helen's talents found new ground. From 1983 to 1987 she headed the Club's Exhibitions Committee (now known as Floral Design) and prepared for a new position - that of Garden Club of America Judge. Not for the faint of heart, the job required successful flower show entries and wins but also clerking, passing and eventually creating future exhibitions for the GCA. From 1989 to 2005 Helen was an Active GCA Judge at major shows throughout the country and later became a Judge Emeritus; the last our club membership has held to date.

It was the field of flower arranging itself that held Helen's most heartfelt passion. Attentive to each entry's design and detail she used a Polaroid camera (no cell phones then!) to create an instant photo of a mock up arrangement long before each actual show. Viewing her work that way allowed an unbiased perspective and led to countless awards.

Some of us were fortunate enough to know and work with Helen Parker. Complete devotion to the Bedford Garden Club and all it stood for was the hallmark of her extraordinary leadership. We will not forget her!

BY-LAWS OF THE BEDFORD GARDEN CLUB, INC.

Last Revised 2011

The BEDFORD GARDEN CLUB wrote its first By-laws in 1911. It is one of the twelve Founder Clubs which in 1913 founded The Garden Club of America.

Article I

Name

This Association shall be known as the BEDFORD GARDEN CLUB, INC.

Article II

Object

The object of the Club shall be to stimulate knowledge and love of gardening among amateurs, to aid in the protection of native plants and birds, and to encourage civic planting and conservation.

Article III

Directors

- 1. The control and conduct of the property and business of the Club shall be vested in a Board of Directors comprised of six members. All directors shall be elected annually by a majority vote of the members of the Club present, or by proxy, at the Annual Meeting of members, including any adjournment thereof, except that vacancies occurring during the year may be temporarily filled by the Board until the next Annual Meeting of members.
- 2. Meetings. The Board of Directors shall meet annually immediately following the Annual Meeting of Members and shall elect officers.* The Board of Directors shall meet at such other dates throughout the year as it may determine.

^{*} Incorporation requires a Board of Directors. The membership elects the directors, who then elect the officers. However, the Nominating Committee, in proposing candidates for the Board, will recommend those whom they propose for specific office (to be shown in parentheses on the slate). It can be assumed that the recommendations of the membership will be followed by the Board.

The Board of Directors will consult with and work with the Executive Committee as described in our By-laws.

3. Quorum of Board of Directors. Fifty percent of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business in any meeting of the directors.

Officers

The officers of the Club shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Second Vice-President, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, and a Treasurer, who shall be elected by the Board of Directors to serve two years or until their successors are elected. Three officers, the President, First Vice-President, and Corresponding Secretary, shall be elected on the odd year; the Second Vice-President, the Recording Secretary, and the Treasurer on the even year. No President shall hold office for more than four years in succession.

Article IV

President

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall be Chairman of the Executive Committee, shall appoint the Chairmen of all Committees, shall arrange for the orientation of new members, and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to her by action of the Club or the Executive Committee, and as pertain to the Office of President, including acting as a legal Trustee of all Club finances. The Vice-President, or in her absence the Second Vice-President, shall have all the powers and shall perform all the duties of the President in case of her absence or disability.

Article V

Treasurer

The Treasurer shall be custodian of all funds, shall disburse all money, shall collect all dues and receive donations and income from special projects. She shall also act as a legal Trustee of all Club finances. She shall present a report at all Regular Meetings and a duly audited Annual Report at the Annual Meeting.

Article VI

Secretaries

The Corresponding Secretary shall give notice of all meetings, shall conduct the correspondence of the Club and notify the Garden Club of America of any changes in membership.

The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings, and act as a legal Trustee of all Club finances.

Article VII

Executive Committee

- 1. The Executive Committee shall consist of the six officers of the Club (the Board of Directors), the Chairmen of all Standing Committees, four members from the Club at large, and upon invitation of the Executive Committee, the Chairmen of Special Committees. In the absence of the Chairman of a Standing Committee or a Special Committee, the Committee's Vice-Chairman shall serve. Subject to these By-laws and to any action taken by the members of the Club at any Annual or Special Meeting, the affairs and business of the Club, the electing of its members and the disbursement of its funds shall be in charge of this Committee.
- 2. The four members from the Club at large shall be elected at the Annual Meeting to serve for one year only, or until their successors are elected.
- 3. During the year, there must be a minimum of six monthly meetings of the Executive Committee, and five days' written or electronic notice shall be given to each member. Seven of its members shall constitute a quorum. Special Meetings may be called by the President or any five members of the Committee.
- 4. The Executive Committee or the President shall submit at each regular meeting of the Club a short report of the affairs of the Club, or such report as the Club may direct.
- 5. The Board of Directors shall have power, in case of a vacancy in any office provided for under Article III or in the elected membership of the Executive Committee, to fill the vacancy for the unexpired term.
- 6. Any member, who has special business she may wish to present to the Executive Committee, is privileged to bring it before a meeting of the Executive Committee, after having notified the Corresponding Secretary of her intention.
- 7. The Executive Committee shall have power to deal with all infringements of the rules of the Club.
- 8. (a) An officer of the Club who shall be absent for three successive meetings without providing a report or explanation satisfactory to the Executive Committee shall be deemed to have resigned.
 - (b) If a Standing Committee is not represented at three successive meetings by a Chairman or Vice-Chairman or by a report of the Committee presented by the Secretary, the Chairman of such Committee shall have deemed to have resigned.

- (c) A member at large must present an explanation satisfactory to the Executive Committee for her absence from three successive meetings.
- 9. Order of business for the Executive Committee shall be as follows:
 - Minutes of the Committee.
 - Treasurer's Report.
 - Reports of both Secretaries.
 - Reports of Standing Committees.
 - Election of new members.
 - Reports of Special Committees.
 - Unfinished business.
 - New business.

Article VIII

Nominating Committee

- 1. This Committee shall consist of five members. The Chairman shall be appointed in October by the President in consultation with the Executive Committee. Two members shall be appointed from the Executive Committee and three from the Club at large. The Chairman will become a member of the Executive Committee. She and her committee will serve for that calendar year.
- 2. The Committee shall nominate a ticket of candidates for the Board of Directors and four members at large and shall notify the Corresponding Secretary, who shall mail a list of candidates so nominated to each member of the Club at least ten days before the Annual Meeting. This committee may also assist the President or President-elect in appointments of all Standing and Special Committees.

Article IX

Custodian

There will be a Custodian, appointed by the President, whose duties it shall be to have the care and custody of all files, records and archives and all other properties of the Club (except funds and securities) when turned over to her by the Officers and Chairmen of Committees.

Article X

Standing Committees

The Chairman of each Standing Committee shall be appointed by the President as soon as may be after the Annual Meeting and announced at the next regular meeting of the members. The members of each Standing Committee shall be appointed by the Chairman of such Committee after consultation with the President.

There shall be the following Standing Committees:

- 1. Program It shall be the duty of this Committee to arrange programs for all meetings covering and consistent with the work and interests of the Standing Committees, and other interests and projects of the Club, to arrange dates and places of meetings subject to the approval of the Executive Committee, and to prepare notices of meetings for the Corresponding Secretary three weeks in advance.
- 2. Membership It shall be the duty of this Committee to receive the names of candidates for membership, to pass on the eligibility of the candidates and to present their names to the Executive Committee, and to inform the Treasurer and Corresponding Secretary of any changes in membership.
- 3. Exhibitions (Known as Flower Show by GCA). It shall be the duty of this Committee to be responsible for flower arranging and for providing workshops for the members. There shall be at least one exhibition each year.
- 4. Conservation and Civic Affairs It shall be the duty of this Committee to encourage the wise and sound management of our natural resources both locally and nationally; to encourage the setting aside and maintenance of natural areas; to stimulate an interest in conservation in the community; to promote interest in community improvement and to work to preserve the integrity, stability and beauty of this area.
- 5. Horticulture It shall be the duty of this Committee to stimulate the knowledge and love of horticulture among the members; to institute courses in horticulture for members, and to cooperate with local horticulture programs.
- 6. Garden History and Design it shall be the duty of this Committee to educate the Members about American landscape and garden design, to demonstrate how American Garden history is and has always been an integral part of the cultural and social life of the communities in which these gardens exist, and to continue to add to the GCA Collection at the Archives of American Gardens by researching, documenting and photographing important American gardens past and present, large and small, simple or complex, classical or vernacular.

Article XI

Meetings

1. Annual Meeting – The Club shall hold an Annual Meeting of the members for the election of Directors and the four members of the Executive Committee from the Club at large and for the transaction of such other business as may come before the meeting. This meeting shall be held in June at such date, hour and place as may be designated by the Board of Directors. Order of business for the Annual Meeting shall be as follows:

Minutes of last Annual Meeting.

Treasurer's Report.

Reports of both secretaries.

Reports of Standing Committees.

Reports of such special Committees as may be designated by the President.

Unfinished business.

President's Report.

Report of the Nominating Committee.

Election of Board of Directors and Members at Large.

Nominations from the floor may precede the elections and a plurality of votes shall elect.

New business.

2. Regular Meetings – A minimum of seven Regular Meetings shall be held each year. The places and the dates proposed by the Program Committee shall be approved by the Executive Committee.

Order of Business for Regular Meetings shall be as follows:

Minutes of last meeting.

Treasurer's Report.

Any reports at the direction of the President.

3. At least ten days' written or electronic notice shall be given each member of all meetings except Special Meetings.

- 4. Special Meetings Special Meetings may be called by the President or at the written request of any five members, sent to the Corresponding Secretary, stating the object for which such meeting is called. The Corresponding Secretary shall notify all members in writing of the date and object of such meeting, giving not less than three days' notice, and no other business than that stated in the notice shall be transacted at a Special Meeting.
- 5. Twenty-five members shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the Club.
- 6. Our Club depends on the active participation of its membership. Members are expected to attend the monthly meetings and to be active in the Standing Committee of their choosing. Members are asked to support and respect the work of their fellow members who organize and plan for each Bedford Garden Club event. In the instance where it is not possible to attend meetings on a regular basis, members are asked to contribute to the Club in ways that will be mutually beneficial.

Article XII

Members

- 1. Admission to membership in the Club shall be limited to those owning property and residing in Northern Westchester County, or renting in this area for a minimum of two years, and exhibiting a strong interest in horticulture, flower arranging, or conservation and civic affairs or garden history and design.
- 2. The total membership excluding Affiliate Members shall not exceed our quota of 125 members of which the total of Associate Members shall not exceed 25 and the combined total of Active and Sustaining Members shall not exceed 100.
- 3. There shall be four classes of membership:
 - a. Active Members. This category constitutes the working members of the Club. They shall attend meetings regularly, serve on committees, and take part in the projects of the Club.
 - b. Associate Members. Associate Members shall have full privileges of the Club, including the power of voting. Their attendance at the Regular Meetings and participation in any active work of the Club is optional. This category of membership shall not exceed 25 in number and shall be limited to any member who has served as a President of the Bedford Garden Club and/or has served on the zone or national level of the GCA.

- c. Sustaining Members. Members who have completed fifteen years of satisfactory service and who are no longer desirous or able to participate in our Club's activities, are eligible for this membership at the discretion of the Executive Committee. These members shall have the privileges offered by the Garden Club of America. They may attend meetings of the Bedford Garden Club and elect to chair a committee, vote or hold an office if they desire.
- d. Affiliate Members. Affiliate Membership may be granted upon request to any member in good standing who has moved to another area.
 - 1. An Affiliate member may not represent her Club as a delegate of a Zone or Annual Meeting.
 - 2. The Bedford Garden Club Affiliate Member is an active member of The Garden Club of America and shall have the privileges offered by the Garden Club of America. The Affiliate Member may attend Bedford Garden Club functions but may not vote, chair any committee or hold office.

Article XIII

New Members

- 1. The first step in proposing a new member is to contact the Membership Committee Chairman who will explain the procedure.
- 2. A candidate of membership shall be proposed and seconded in writing by members of the Club. The letters of the proposer and seconder together with three letters from members by whom the candidate is well known shall be sent to the Chairman of the Membership Committee. Those on the Membership Committee may not write these recommendations.
- 3. A member may propose only one and second only one candidate for membership and may write only three endorsing letters during a Club year. A member may not write for a relative for membership in the Club. A member may not propose, second or endorse names for membership until she herself has been a member for six months.
- 4. Candidates shall be considered by the Membership Committee in the order of the submission of their names together with the letters of their proposers, seconders and three endorsing letters as above provided, and no candidate shall be considered until all the requirements of this By-law shall have been complied with.

- 5. Former members and children of former or present members whose names are proposed for membership shall be considered prior to other candidates. Former members who desire to be reinstated need only be proposed and seconded in writing by members. The six Officers and those on the Membership Committee may not write these recommendations. Reinstated members shall have the original date of membership, resignation and reentry listed in the Yearbook.
- 6. Candidates duly proposed and presented as provided for above shall be voted on by the Executive Committee for admission to the Club. Voting shall be by secret ballot. Two adverse votes shall exclude.
- 7. Active Members are expected to serve on at least one of the following committees: Horticulture, Exhibitions, or Conservation and Civic Affairs or Garden History and Design unless excused by the Executive Committee for extenuating circumstances.
- 8. In conformity with the Garden Club of America policy regarding dual membership, incoming members of the Bedford Garden Club shall not hold membership in two Garden Club of America's Clubs situated in one locality.

Article XIV

Resignation

Resignation from membership shall be made to the Membership Chairman in writing.

Article XV

Annual Dues

Dues are subject to change at the discretion of the Executive Committee and the Garden Club of America.

All dues include the dues of the Garden Club of America. All members who shall have failed to pay these dues within a month of the second notice shall cease to be members of the Club, except as provided under Article VII, Section 7.

Article XVI

Guests

Members may bring their house guests to any meeting of the Club except Annual or Special Meetings. Persons living in the neighborhood who are not members of the Bedford Garden Club are not entitled to attend meetings except with the approval of the Membership Chairman and the President. The Hostess should be consulted when a meeting is held in a member's house.

Article XVII

Amendments

These By-laws may be amended at an Annual or Special Meeting by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting. No amendment shall be considered unless the Corresponding Secretary shall have mailed or electronically mailed a copy thereof to each member of the Club at least ten days before the meeting.

Article XVIII

Disposition of Funds

No part of the assets of the Club shall inure to the benefit of any member of the Club. In the event of the dissolution of the Club, all remaining funds shall be turned over to the Garden Club of America.

Article XIX

Policy

Any service rendered to the Club by a member should be provided at cost with no profit to that member.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF HOSTESSES

- (1) It is the responsibility of the Chairman of Hostesses to appoint a Head Hostess and four cohostesses for each Garden Club meeting, in addition to the member in whose house the meeting is held.
 - (a) In the event that the appointed Head Hostess cannot fulfill her responsibilities, she is expected to get a replacement and report the change to the Chairman of Hostesses at least two months before her assigned meeting.
 - (b) The Head Hostess and her co-hostesses make and work out all details and arrangements involving hospitality for the meeting and tea.
 - (c) The Head Hostess should confer first with the member in whose house the meeting is being held to ascertain what will be needed in the way of chairs, coat racks, flowers, food, china, silver, direction signs, parking attendant and table for the President.
 - (d) The Head Hostess then makes arrangements with her co-hostesses to work out details and decide what will be provided for refreshments. She contacts the Treasurer for money from the Hostess Fund, which is provided through the dues, as an assessment of \$5 per member.
 - (e) The Head Hostess should contact the Corresponding Secretary a few days before the meeting to find out how many acceptances have been received. She should not purchase any plastic cups, napkins, plates, etc., until our supply is exhausted. The Custodian is in charge of these items as well as the large coffee and hot water (for tea) pots, which are needed upon occasions.
- (2) Co-hostesses may be asked to come the morning of the meeting to help set up chairs or to stay after the meeting to help the hostess put her house back in order.
 - (a) If a co-hostess is unable to fulfill her responsibilities, she is to get a substitute and report the change to her Head Hostess at least two months before her assigned meeting.
- (3) Flower arrangements are the responsibility of the hostesses. If the help of the Flower Arranging Committee is desired, it should be requested in plenty of time.
- (4) All members are asked in turn to be hostesses and it is hoped that all meeting and tea arrangements will be kept as simple as possible.
- (5) During their term of office, the President, two Secretaries, Treasurer and Chairmen of Civic Affairs and Conservation, Flower Arranging, Horticulture and Programs will be excluded from being asked to be hostesses.
